REGION PROCEDURES R-12

Need to adjust for virtual with SIA

- D. The voting members of Conference shall be the members of the Region Board and the accredited delegates of each club in good standing.
- E. A club shall be deemed in good standing if all requirements of the Federation Bylaws and Procedures as well as all procedures established by the Region Conference and Region Board have been met at the time its delegates register.
- F. Delegates:
 - (1) The delegates of each club shall be the President and two (2) active members.
 - (2) A delegate may represent only the club in which the delegate's membership is held.

STANDING RULES FOR REGION CONFERENCE

- 1. All voting delegates shall be seated together in front seats promptly at the beginning of each session.
- 2. The Agenda, as adopted, shall be the order of the day.
- 3. Changes in the Agenda may be made only by majority vote of the Conference.
- 4. After addressing the Chair and being recognized each delegate shall clearly state her name and name of her club.
- 5. A voting member may speak twice upon a subject and only for <u>two</u> minutes. Other members may speak once upon a subject for two minutes only.
- 6. Both delegates and non-voting members shall be allowed the privilege of the floor but precedence shall be accorded delegates.
- 7. No conference discussion may be released for publicity unless first approved by the Public Relations Committee.
- 8. All motions of any length must be submitted in writing to the Secretary at the time they are made. Forms are available.
- 9. All reports shall be in writing and a copy handed to the Region Secretary at the time the report is given to the Conference.

INFORMATION FOR DELEGATES

The elected delegates should have a working knowledge of Soroptimist Laws, Region Procedures, the objectives and ideals of the organization, and experience as a member of club committees or of the board. Understanding parliamentary procedure, ability to work with others, and a spirit of good will and understanding will help the delegate, the club, and the Conference Body.

The Club President, who is a delegate and who serves as the leader of the clubs delegations, should:

- ✓ Allocate time at a business meeting to discuss topics in the agenda, so that a majority opinion expressed by the club will serve as a guide to delegates.
- ✓ Arrange with other delegates for dividing topics of the report on Conference to be given to the club.
- ✓ Schedule time at a post-Conference club meeting, as soon as possible after Conference, for delegates to present their reports.

Responsibilities of Club Delegates

Before Conference, each delegate should:

- > Study the Call
- ➤ Be sure all reservations are sent in promptly
- ➤ Clarify financial responsibilities, according to club procedures
- ➤ Collect materials, etc. to take to Conference, including Soroptimist pin

During Conference, each delegate should:

- > Register promptly
- ➤ Be on time to all sessions
- > Attend all sessions
- > Be prepared to write down important business proceedings and background information to report to the club
- ➤ Be familiar with and observe the Conference Standing Rules
- > Participate in discussion and debate
- ➤ Vote with the club viewpoint in mind. If instructed by the club to vote a certain way, vote that way. If not instructed, use your best judgment, considering the best interests of your club and of the all clubs in the Region.
- ➤ Be willing to accept an assignment from the Governor if asked.

After Conference, each delegate should:

Prepare a report as instructed by the Club President. The following outline might be helpful:

- A. Action by Conference approving proposed changes in laws, the budget, or other matters presented to the voting body, and the reason for each action.
- B. Ideas for increasing club interest and support in attaining Soroptimist Goals.
- C. Summary of the workshops and committee presentations.
- D. The gist of speeches.
- E. A summary of proposals not approved by the Conference, and the reason for disapproval.
- F. Awards: who won them and why, hints for helping your club win next year.
- G. Your personal evaluation of the Conference.

Minutes of the CECR Delegates Conference Call Wednesday, 04/15/20

Governor Deborah Mackes called the meeting to order at 7:15 PM.

Governor Debbie pointed out that the meeting would be recorded for the purpose of taking minutes, and the meeting was an information only meeting.

Governor Debbie stated that votes would not be cast during this meeting, and that the meeting was timed to last one (1) hour.

Governor Debbie took role call.

- CECR Board Members present were: Governor Deborah Mackes, Governor-Elect Connie Morris, Secretary Betty Ann O'Brien, Treasurer Cheryl Walter, Board Member Cindy Swicegood, and Board Member Deb Keller.
- Club names were called in alpha order, then by delegate name representing each club.
- According to CECR Bylaws, Article VI, Meetings, Section 6.4 states that a quorum for any meeting for the Region shall be 10 delegates from at least 7 clubs. Thus, a quorum was present to proceed with the meeting. Twelve (12) clubs were represented and forty (40) delegates were in attendance

Also participating in this meeting were Lou Anne Hunicutt, CECR Parliamentarian, SI-Mid-Atlantic Online; Robin Davis, CECR Public Awareness Chair, SI-Woodbridge; Warie Brock, CECR Teller, SI-Montgomery County; and two members of the 2020-2022 Nominating Committee, Louise Skinner, Nominating Committee Chair, SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties; and Virginia (Ginny) Dempsey, SI-Woodbridge.

Governor Debbie announced the winners of the 2020 "Betty Jean (BJ) Cook Club Achievement Governor's Award".

- Two (2) clubs sent entries in by the due date of 03/20/20. Both clubs submitted excellent write-ups about their respective Club membership experiences. Governor Debbie declared a First Place tie between the two clubs.
- With the advanced approval of the CECR Board, it was agreed that both SI-Upper Montgomery County and SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties receive \$100.00 towards their 2020-2021 Live Your Dream (LYD) Programs when they identify their Club's LYD Recipient to the Region Governor. Governor Debbie extended congratulations to each winning club.
- It was stated that this award must be claimed prior to the 2021 Spring Conference, and that payments and certificates would be presented at a later date.

Governor Debbie asked that CECR Treasurer Cheryl Walter announce the winner of the "Benny G. Mendelson Region Recruitment Award" presented to the club having the largest net increase in members from April 1 to March 31 of the current club year (2019-2020). Treasurer Cheryl announced that the winner was SI-Havre de Grace, with twelve (12) new members. SI-Havre de Grace will receive \$100.00 towards their club's 2020-2021 Dream It Be It (DIBI) Program when the club identifies this to the Region Governor. It was stated that this award must be claimed prior to the 2021 Spring Conference. Payment and Certificate will be presented at a later date.

Governor Debbie reported on the LYD Program, and was pleased to announce that 18 out of 19 CECR Clubs participated, listed as follows:

SI-Cumberland, SI-Fairfax, SI-Frostburg, SI-Hagerstown, SI-Hampton Roads, SI-Havre de Grace, SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties, SI-Manassas, SI-Mid Atlantic Online, SI-Montgomery County, SI-Prince George & Anne Arundel Counties, SI-Raleigh, SI-Salisbury, SI-Talbot County, SI-Upper Montgomery County, SI-Wake Forest, SI-Williamsburg, and SI-Woodbridge

- Governor Debbie also announced that the winners from SI-Frostburg, SI-Manassas, SI-Mid Atlantic Online, and SI-Montgomery County went on to receive a Region LYD Award of \$1,000.00 each.
- The winner from SI-Hagerstown went on to receive an SIA LYD Award of \$3,000.00.
- The winner from SI-Prince George & Anne Arundel Counties went on to receive an SIA LYD Award of \$5,000.00.
- The winner from SI-Upper Montgomery County went on to receive the \$1,500.00 Award that was donated by SI-Alexandria.

Governor Debbie let everyone know that monetary awards and certificates have already been sent to the awardees, and that club certificates would be presented at a later date.

Governor Debbie then announced that 10 out of 19 CECR Clubs participated in the "Dream It Be It: Career Support for Girls" Program. They are as follows:

SI-Frostburg, SI-Hagerstown, SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties, SI-Manassas, SI-Prince George & Anne Arundel Counties, SI-Raleigh, SI-Talbot County, SI-Upper Montgomery County, SI-Wake Forest, and SI-Woodbridge

Governor Debbie also announced that certificates would be presented at a later date.

Govern Debbie then asked Deb Keller, CECR Celebrating Success Chair, SI-Talbot County, announce the Celebrating Success Club Participants in each of SIA's 4 Pillar Programs and the winning club in each pillar.

- Deb reported that in the category of "Membership", 6 clubs participated, with the winner being SI-Manassas for their club's "Focus on Fellowship" Program
- Deb reported that in the category of **"Fundraising"**, 8 clubs participated, with the winner being SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties for their club's "Designer Purse Bingo" event.
- Deb reported that in the category of "**Program**", 8 clubs participated, with the winner being SI-Raleigh for their club's "LYD Awards Going Beyond a Cash Award" Program.
- Deb reported that in the category of "Public Awareness", 4 clubs participated, with the winner being SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties for their "Queen Anne's County Fair" event.
- Deb reported that 10 clubs participated in at least one of the 4 Pillar categories.

Deb also announced that the next Celebrating Success Club entries were due to her by 07/01/20, and that she would send out a reminder to clubs.

Governor Debbie then said that clubs would receive certificates at a later date.

Governor Debbie then asked Louise Skinner, CECR's 2020-2022 Board Nominating Committee Chair to present the 2020-2022 Board Slate of Officers.

Louise recognized the members of the 2020-2022 Nominating Committee, which were Virginia (Ginny) Dempsey, SI-Woodbridge; and Becky Paluzsay, SI-Williamsburg

Chair Louise stated that the slate of officers, for Central East Coast Region's 2020-2022 Board of Directors, are as follows:

 - o Virginia (Ginny) Dempsey, SI-Woodbridge, VA

Governor Debbie asked that CECR Treasurer Cheryl Walter present the CECR 2020-2022 Region Budget.

- Questions were directed to Treasurer Cheryl with discussions that followed.
 There were no motions made.
- Attendees requested a copy of CECR's Year to Date Actuals Report for month ending 03/31/20 of which Governor Debbie and Treasurer Cheryl stated would be made available to all delegates at the same time when the minutes of today's meeting are sent when the online voting process was completed.
- Governor Debbie invited attendees to submit questions to her on Club related subjects.

Governor Debbie asked Robin Davis, Public Awareness Chair, to explain the online voting process in which the delegates would cast votes on the 2020-2022 Slate of Officers and the CECR 2020-2022 Region Budget. Robin explained that information to conduct the online voting would be sent to delegates that she had current email addresses for, following the Delegates Call. They would have until Friday, 04/17/20 at 5 PM to cast their vote.

Governor Debbie reported that Warie Brock, SI-Montgomery County, would serve in the capacity of CECR's Teller.

Governor Debbie announced that Robin Davis of SI-Woodbridge, Louise Skinner of SI-Kent & Queen Anne's Counties, and Lou Anne Hunnicutt of SI-Mid Atlantic Online would serve as the three-member committee to review and approve the minutes of the 04/15/20 Delegates Conference Call.

With no further business to discuss Governor Deborah Mackes adjourned the meeting at 8:10 PM.


